





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Kiriko is a technique of making cuts in the surface of glass using a grinder. In fact, it is a very old technique, that has been around for about 200 years.

The characteristic of Edo Kiriko is that it is carved at an acute angle. This is a traditional craft from Tokyo.

And the cut edges are sharp and reflect light well, so I decided to incorporate a LED into the door handle itself to make the cut edges stand out even more beautifully.

| Material | stainless steel + glass |
|------------------|--|
| Finish | Oxidized gold paint |
| Length | L=250mm(9-13/16in) |
| Center to Center | P1=84mm(3-5/16in) |
| Projection | 57mm(2-1/4in) |
